Purpose of Report: To recommend to Council that the scheme of polling

districts and polling places detailed in Appendix 2 is adopted and that the Chief Executive's current delegated authority to agree necessary changes of polling place, after consultation with the Chair of the Licensing and General Purposes Committee, relevant District Ward Member(s), County Council Member and parish or town

council, should continue.

Recommendation(s): Recommendation to COUNCIL: That:

1) the Polling Scheme in Appendix 2 be approved; and

the Chief Executive's current delegated authority to agree necessary changes of polling place after consultation with the Chair of the Licensing and General Purposes Committee, relevant District Ward Member(s), County Council Member and Parish Council should continue. Should any of the consultees not agree the proposed change, the decision to be brought to the Licensing and General Purposes Committee and full Council for determination.

Introduction

- 1. Under the Representation of the People Act 1983, the Council has a duty to divide its area into polling districts and to designate a polling place for each district.
- 2. The following definitions may be helpful when reading the report and Appendices.
 - "Polling districts" are geographical electoral areas into which wards and constituencies may be sub-divided.
 - "Polling places" are the buildings or areas designated by the Council where electors in a polling district go to vote in person.
 - "Polling stations" are the number of issuing desks in the building or area that is the designated polling place.
- 3. The Electoral Administration Act 2006, as amended, introduced a duty on all local authorities in Great Britain to review their polling districts and polling places at least once every five years.

- 4. Under section 18C of the Representation of the People Act 1983, the next compulsory review was required be undertaken within a 16-month window between 1 October 2023 and 31 January 2025.
- 5. In addition, the Boundary Commission for England (BCE) has recently undertaken a review of parliamentary constituency boundaries. The Commission has now published its final recommendations, and Orders for the new parliamentary constituency boundaries are due to be made before the end of November 2023. The new boundaries will be used for the next general election, which must take place by 28 January 2025.
- 6. In accordance with the above, the Council began its current review on 2 October 2023. This included a six-week public consultation period which concluded on 13 November. The full timetable and review process are detailed below. Resulting changes to electoral arrangements will be included in the revised register of electors, which is due to be published on 1 February 2024.
- 7. The review considers the arrangements for polling districts and polling places at UK Parliamentary elections and thus covers the arrangements in place for the parts of Bexhill and Battle and the Hastings and Rye constituencies that fall within Rother. These arrangements remain in place for other elections.
- 8. It is important to note that the review does not cover parliamentary, local government or parish boundaries, or the naming of these electoral areas, which are subject to separate review processes conducted by the BCE or Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE), as appropriate.
- 9. Rother currently has 72 polling districts, each of which are aligned with parish or parish ward boundaries.

The Review Process

- 10. The statutory criteria for a review of polling districts and polling places is attached to this report as Appendix 1. In particular, as part of the review process the Council must:
 - seek to ensure that all electors in the constituency have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances;
 - seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable, the polling places are accessible to those who are disabled; and
 - when considering or reviewing the designation of a polling place, have regard to the accessibility needs of disabled persons.
- 11. The Council was required to publish notice of the holding of a review and a consultation document. Information about the review was made available on the Council's website and could also be obtained in person at the Town Hall in Bexhill-on-Sea.
- 12. The Council was required to consult the (Acting) Returning Officer (ARO) for every Parliamentary constituency that is wholly or partly within its area.
- 13. The consultation document was also sent to the local Members of Parliament, District Councillors, County Councillors, Parish and Town Councils, local

- political parties and other stakeholders, including local disability groups, to seek comments on the current polling arrangements and draft proposals. Additionally, members of the public were invited to comment.
- 14. In addition to responses received as part of the consultation, feedback from polling station staff and Polling Station Inspectors has also been considered. In particular, all Presiding Officers and Polling Station Inspectors are given a survey to complete at each election, to provide feedback on the polling station venue. This feedback is reviewed post-election and informs the recommendations made during the review.
- 15. The timetable for the review is set out below:

Outcome of the Consultation Process and Summary of Recommendations

- 16. A total of 23 responses to the consultation were received. These are included in Appendix 2.
- 17. Comments were received regarding the location of polling stations in relation to voters in BHKE2 (Bexhill Kewhurst) and BHPE1, BHPE2 and PHPE3 (Bexhill Pebsham & St Michaels). In both cases it was queried why voters have to travel to a polling station that is further away than an alternative polling station which is closer to them. However, both of these issues relate to local government boundaries which have been set by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE), and therefore are outside of the remit of this review. It is suggested that these issues are instead considered when the LGBCE conduct their next boundary review.
- 18. The ARO's comments and proposals regarding polling places and polling stations are included in the consultation document for this review and are detailed in the attached Appendix 2. There are **six** changes to the existing polling places and polling stations that the Committee is asked to recommend:

- i. BHKE2 (Bexhill Kewhurst), BHSS1 & BHSS2 (both Bexhill St Stephens) The current polling place for these three polling districts, Bexhill Leisure Centre, is not considered ideal as it is located outside BHKE2 and BHSS1 and at the border of BHSS2. The previous polling place for all three polling districts, St Stephen's Church Hall, is no longer available for use and we have been unable to identify any other suitable alternatives within the polling district. It is therefore proposed that the whole polling district is designated as the polling place to allow for an alternative venue to be used, if one becomes available.
- ii. BHSA1 & BHSA2 (both Bexhill Sackville) The current polling place is Manor Barn. However, we have received several comments from members of the public (both before and as part of the review) that the previous polling place, St Mary Magdalene's Church Hall, was preferable due to its location. Unfortunately, it is currently unavailable due to repair works, with no estimated re-opening date. St Barnabas Church in Sea Road has been identified as a suitable alternative, and it has been agreed to use the venue at an upcoming parish by-election. It is proposed that the whole polling district is designated as the polling place, to allow for the use of St Barnabas Church again, if it is deemed to be satisfactory, or alternatively for St Mary Magdalene's Church Hall to be used again if it becomes available again in the future.
- iii. **BHSI1** (**Bexhill Sidley**) The previous polling place, All Saints Community Hall, is no longer available. Sidley Freedom Church was used as a polling place at the most recent elections, however it is not in the polling district. We have investigated alternative venues but have not been able to identify a suitable alternative in the polling district that is available. It is therefore proposed that the whole polling district is designated as the polling place, to allow for an alternative venue to be used if one becomes available.
- iv. **RYF (Rye Foreign)** The current polling place, Playden Women's Institute Hall, is not in the polling district. However, we are not aware of any suitable alternatives within the polling district. Hub on Rye Hill has been suggested by a member of the public as part of the review and is currently under consideration as a possible polling station venue. It is proposed that the whole polling district is designated the polling place to allow for Hub on Rye Hill to be used if it is deemed to be suitable.
- v. **TCFL (Flimwell)** The previous polling place was Flimwell Playing Field Pavilion. However, the whole polling district was designated as the polling place at the last polling review in 2019, as the new Flimwell Village Hall was under construction and nearing completion. The venue is now available for hire and is considered suitable for use. It is therefore proposed that Flimwell Village Hall is designated the polling place.
- vi. **WFWL (Westfield)** The current polling place, Westfield Church Hall, is not in the polling district. However, we are not aware of any suitable alternatives within the polling district. It is proposed that the whole polling district is designated as the polling place to allow for an alternative venue to be used if one becomes available.

Implications

Financial Implications

19. There are no financial implications for the proposals within this report.

Legal Implications

20. There are no legal implications for the proposals within this report. This review has been undertaken in accordance with the provisions of the Representation of the People Act 1983.

Human Resources Implications

21. There are no Human Resource implications for the proposals within this report.

Environmental

22. The locations of Polling Places are determined by the ward boundaries and whilst every effort is made to ensure that Polling Places are easily accessible and walkable to many electors, this is not always possible, particularly where residents live on the ward boundary.

Equalities and Diversity

23. The statutory criteria states that the Council must seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable every polling place for which it is responsible is accessible to electors who are disabled.

Risk Management

24. It is a statutory duty of the Council to review and approve Polling Districts and Polling Places arrangements at least every five years. The changes proposed in this review are minor and can only benefit voters. There are therefore no risks associated with this report.

Conclusion

- 25. The Committee is asked to recommend to Council that it adopts the scheme of polling districts and polling places detailed in Appendix 2.
- 26. Additionally, the Committee is asked to recommend to Council that the Chief Executive's current delegated authority to agree necessary changes of polling place after consultation with the Chair of the Licensing and General Purposes Committee, relevant District Ward Member(s), County Council Member and Parish or Town Council should continue. Should any of the consultees not agree the proposed change, the decision to be brought to the Licensing and General Purposes Committee and full Council for determination.

STATUTORY CRITERIA FOR REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS, POLLING PLACES AND POLLING STATIONS

The Representation of People Act 1983 (Sections 18A and 18B) sets out the criteria which the local authority must demonstrate that they have met as far as practicable. The statutory criteria are:

Polling districts at Parliamentary Elections

- "18A (1) Every constituency is to be divided into polling districts.
 - A relevant authority must -(2)
 - divide its area into polling districts for the purpose of Parliamentary (a) elections for so much of any constituency as is situated in its area; and
 - keep the polling districts under review (b)
 - The following rules apply -(3)
 - the authority must seek to ensure that all electors in a constituency in (a) its area have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances:
 - in England, each parish is to be a separate polling district. (b)
 - Subsection (3) (b) does not apply if, in any case, there are special (4) circumstances."

Polling places at Parliamentary Elections

- "18B (1) A polling place is to be designated for each polling district in a constituency.
 - (2) But subsection (1) does not apply if the size or other circumstances of a polling district are such that the situation of the polling stations does not materially affect the convenience of the electors or any body of them.
 - (3) A relevant authority must -
 - designate the polling places for the polling districts in its area, and (a)
 - (b) keep the polling places in its area under review.
 - (4) The following rules apply -
 - the authority must seek to ensure that all electors in a constituency in (a) its area have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances:
- the authority must seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and (b) Page 7

- practicable every polling place for which it is responsible is accessible to electors who are disabled.
- (c) the authority must have regard to the accessibility to disabled persons of potential polling stations in any place which it is considering designating as a polling place or the designation of which as a polling place it is reviewing;
- (d) the polling place for a polling district must be an area in the district, unless special circumstances make it desirable to designate an area wholly or partly outside the district.
- (e) the polling place for a polling district must be small enough to indicate to electors in different parts of the district how they will be able to reach the polling station.
- (5) If no polling place is designated for a polling district the polling district is to be taken to be the polling place."

Luckily my wife was with me, otherwise I would not have been able to get over the hurdle of the door 	
					threshold, which is quite high, I then had to go down a ramp covering a couple of stairs, which seemed quite flimsy, on eventually reaching the desk, I noticed that all

the polling booths were at the other end of the room, and so once I had registered, I had to walk alone, about 15 meters across the not very flat floor to the station, vote and then walk back.

The whole thing was for me felt like an accident waiting to happen. As I left I heard a couple of other older people complaining, saying how difficult it had been.

I got home and wrote to the independent councillors of our ward complaining, and they agreed, that they needed to find a new venue.

Unfortunately I do not know of anywhere that would be suitable, but if you would like someone to road test a new venue, I would be more than willing, health allowing." – Member of the public

 "I would like to take this opportunity to comment on the last polling arrangements for Sackville Ward in Bexhill on Sea.

The polling station was moved from St Mary Magdalen's Church in Sea Road to Manor Barn, De La Warr Road. This is, in my opinion, an entirely unsuitable venue due to its location and I cannot understand why it was chosen. It is right on the outskirts of this ward, a very long way from the other sides of the ward, and very difficult to get to by foot for a lot of people due to the distance and a walk up a very steep hill. As far as I am aware there was no vehicular arrangements made for voters to get to Manor Barn from the sea front or the centre of town or any other part of the ward.

There were arrangements made for parking in the Manor Barn Car Park for voters without having to pay. However this was not sufficiently publicised and virtually no one knew about it. It also does not alter the fact that many residents were simply unable to get there.

I would therefore request that any future elections are moved back to St Mary Magdalen, or another venue in a

				 more central location, that voters of all ages and mobile abilities are able to get to." – Member of the public "It seems we must have the Manor Barn for the polling station. Is there a reason why St Barnabas Church in Sea Road isn't used? That's much easier for me to walk to." – Member of the public

 "For so many people, especially the elderly and disabled living nearer the sea front of Bexhill, Manor Barn is a very inconvenient venue and we can't understand why the voting station was moved from St Mary Magdalen's church. What was the perceived benefit of such a change?

We would like to suggest that voting be moved back to somewhere more central to the ward and not on the top edge. If St Mary Magdalen's church is no longer available, would somewhere like St Barnabas be possible as the area around it is flat and it is easily accessible? Also, St Barnabas is aiming to become much more of a community hub and is a well-known venue locally." – Members of the public

"We wish to add our comments to the polling station review. As pensioners without a car who live at the Galley Hill end of Cantelupe road, we found that having to go to the old town to vote was quite a trek. From our point of view St Barnabas Church on sea road is much more accessible and is actually in our polling area, unlike Manor Barn. It may not sound far but it is 4 buses to get to and from where we are to Manor barn and back. And as the community bus only goes 3 times a day you can see the difficulties. There are many people who live here near the seafront in the same position, without transport and who are elderly." – Members of the public

Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places - Hastings & Rye parliamentary constituency

Thank you for the recent letter from your Electoral Services Manager, Richard Adams. This invited me, as the (Acting) Returning Officer of Hastings & Rye parliamentary constituency, to comment on your current review of polling districts and polling places.

I have reviewed the consultation documentation received and fully support the proposals made by Rother District Council, in relation to the Rye part of the constituency. I also note that the constituency boundaries within the Rother area will change for Hastings & Rye following the completion of the Boundary Commission for England's recent review.

It is vitally important to focus on access for all electors, including those with disabilities. We should always strive to ensure that polling stations are fully accessible, but realise this is not always possible, given the limited numbers of venues within an area. This is certainly a challenge in the Hastings part of the constituency. Nevertheless, I feel we should continue to aspire to make our polling stations as accessible as possible.

In addition, and while I fully support your proposals, my previous electoral experience suggests that further changes to polling stations will sometimes be forced upon us, when current locations are no longer available. Similarly, new locations may become available from time to time and present opportunities to improve access and/or facilities. I hope it will be possible to take full advantage of these opportunities.
